The House of Delegates meeting for the Dixie District was, itself, a further example of evident declining interest in the convention. Only 19 chapters were represented at the meeting, one more than required for a quorum and doing business. Most of that business was given over to attempting to deal with declining revenues for the District. Several ideas were mentioned as possible ways to make more income. As to cutting expenses, the District will stop using color in the Rebel Rouser, and will publish the magazine electronically via email with only a small number of copies actually printed. This is projected to save some \$1,600 per issue. Also, COTS will no longer use a motel for the seminars, but will instead (this January) use a church in Marietta for the training. Finally, the District voted to increase dues by \$5.00 per year. It was noted that the Society presently had 29,200 members as of August 06, down 527. The District was down net 9 at this time, with an approximate total membership in the District of approximately 1,800 members.

Here is a note you might appreciate. "Gentlemen, It was a tremendous pleasure to have the opportunity to work with each of you again in Chattanooga. I primarily work with the five of you directly, but the entire convention team is to be commended for a superb effort in handling our competitors, attendees, judges and special guests.

And I know all of the judges were most appreciative of your services and friendship during the entire weekend. Thanks again for coming through for us! Please convey my thanks also to your team for their services as well.

Fred, I have never seen such quick turn around on the printing of the official scoring forms! I don't know how you did it, but you were most efficient! Thanks for seeing to the needs of the panel. I know they were all very appreciative of your efforts

If you haven't already indicated to Gary Fisher your intent to join us at the Christmas party December 16, it's time to get that done. I am hoping that the majority of the Chorus will be able to attend and that our usual fellowship abounds. Perhaps we will even be able to muster up the gumption to sing a couple of Christmas carols - though by then we will have sung a whole bunch of gigs! If my calendar is anything like accurate, we have six gigs booked, not counting the extra called rehearsal for Nov. 30. Wow! I thank you all, in advance, for your effort and endurance. And for the fellowship we all enjoy so much.

On Monday, before the break - White Christmas, Christmas Song in chairs, review all other music on risers. After the break - the rest of the 12 Days and Let It Snow.

I talked about leading tone again last night A leading tone is one-half step away from the tone you're aiming at. For example if you sing the scale - "do, re, mi, fa, sol, la, ti" - and stop, some (maybe most) people will try to kill you. The unfinished nature of the notes you sang almost demands a final "do". At that point "ti" is the leading tone, one-half step away from "do". Due to the nature of barbershop harmony, we find leading tones both in melody and harmony notes. Our harmony revolves (mostly) around the "circle of fifths", where a barbershop seventh chord "leads" to a tonic chord in the related key. An example of this would be a G7 chord (G, B, D, F) leading to a C chord (C, E, G, C). Notice that the B in the G7 is one-half step away from the C. Not only is this a leading-tone situation, but the B is the third of the G7 and would require extra attention to pitch anyway. We almost always tend to sing the leading tone flat and a little attention to these situations is a great way to keep on pitch in the chorus.

I put a pyramid on the blackboard Monday night and labeled it "Why Barbershop?" I think it summarizes, in a nutshell, just exactly why we do this part-time hobby.

First of all...at the base of the pyramid is "Brotherhood". Think of brotherhood as a type of fraternity, a group of men gathered together to achieve one particular purpose, to perform a public service, to achieve a level that we could not reach on our own through rehearsals. We certainly didn't join the ChooChoo Chorus for the money, for the prestige, for the driving force it makes upon the world. We do it because it's fun. We hope to achieve, with the assistance of the men around us, a harmony of sound that blends together into a pleasing tune that will entertain others.

Second on the pyramid is "Perform". Ah...the true reason for us getting together and spending countless hours of rehearsal just for the 10 minutes, half hour, or an hour of time we stand in front of a group of people hoping to elicit the emotion from them that also inspires us. How much time do you spend away from Monday nights for two-and-a-half hours? I personally give it just about as much time over the expanse of a week in tuning my ear to the training CD and trying to emulate the sounds I hear there...whether it be in my car, at home, or in my office (with the door closed). The "Perform" section of the pyramid is the true reason we do what we do.

Our third pyramid block is "Compete". There are some that don't like to compete and are downcast when we do and come in last place. I guess that is why "compete" is at the top of the pyramid...because it gives us a place to aspire to. It's a pinnacle that we have to get to by building upon those two blocks (Brotherhood and Perform) that are below us. Discouraging to come in last? Of course, but the only way up and out of the cellar is to climb those two steps and keep striving to reach the top.

So...

- 1) BROTHERHOOD rehearse, rehearse, rehearse...and have fun doing it with a group of men who all want the same thing.
- 2. PERFORM get out onto the stage before the public and put all those rehearsal hours to good use by entertaining and hearing the applause.
- 3. COMPETE a goal to continuously strive to do better by building on the lower blocks. Work toward being the best you can be and hearing the efforts of like brotherhoods during a competition.

Bill Brinkman reported: national president Noah Funderburk is from Dixie, membership is still declining and we are down to 28,900 internationally, a loss of 800 this year, we are trying to divide the district into subreagions to boost attendance at meetings, please attend International in Denver, headquarters moves to Nashville in August, conventions are not just about competition, but a chance to see friends and engage in singing for fun, and the Rocky Mount Chorus will be 'mic tester' at International and is open for anyone whether you are a member or not. So if anyone wants to sing on the International stage, they can obtain the music and a learning CD for \$20. You must qualify in Denver before you are allowed to go on stage. The 2007 budget was passed. Chattanooga was recognized as a Gold contributor to Harmony Foundation donating \$75 per member.

We are a chorus divided. Not on a social level. We get along great. It is on the issue of how we practice that we disagree. The disagreement is expressed not in words so much as in attendance. In spite of having a good inflow of new members our numbers remain about the same. We lose people as fast as we gain new ones. At this point in my new job as chapter development VP I have not pushed recruiting new members but have spent my time trying to understand why this is happening. Almost everyone I talk to thinks they know what is wrong and what we should do to fix it. Unfortunately nearly all these opinions are different. I have come to the conclusion that we just can't agree. When we were "big sloppy fun" we lost members that didn't want to be a part of poor quality singing. When Paul tries to improve our quality by making us practice until we get it right we lose members who don't like starting and stopping all the time. When we try to improve our quality of singing at contest by spending most of our practice time on contest songs we lose some because they get bored. When we insist that those who are going to contest learn 95 % all the words and notes, and prove it by assessments; we lose some because they think we are going too far and we lose others because they think we aren't going far enough. When we did a survey to try to document want the members of the chorus wanted, we had little we agreed upon and had opinions as far apart as you can get on many issues. It appears that we can maintain the chorus at it's current level by recruiting enough new members to replace those we lose. If we do nothing different this is probably our fate. It could be worse- for sure. I for one am not satisfied with this, however; because I know it could be better. The only solution I see is compromise, not compromise on our singing quality but on what it takes to improve it. The most talented singers need to be more patient with the process of bringing the less talented up to an acceptable level and the less talented need to be willing to work harder at improving their ability. One of these without the other will not work. It takes both sides of this coin to buy what we want. This is not something leadership can fix. Individuals have to want it enough to make it happen. Exactly how individuals can do this I don't know but the answers can be found if every member is motivated enough to try. Everyone should ask themselves, what can I do to improve the chorus? Formulate a

plan, talk about your plan with your section leader or other officers of the chapter. Don't sit around doing nothing but complaining. Accept the responsibility to make the chorus better all by yourself. If everyone does this the sky is the limit for us.

I don't think we get much credit for it in the District, but it really makes me proud to watch the Choo Choo Chorus carry off the mind-boggling task.

And then there's the little matter of our competing. We need everyone at rehearsals and working on music outside of rehearsals and . . . well, whatever it takes. To me, the bottom line at competition is whether each of us sang the very best he possibly could as a member of the Chorus, not just words and music, and face, but also in blending with the entire Chorus. If we did that, then, in my opinion, we have won, whatever the judges' scores.

Secretary - Fred Jesse

When I took the job as Secretary for the Chorus, I knew it was a job inperpetuum (forever). When David Renolds left the job and then retired to Louisana, I also assumed the job of Chapter Historian and Archivist. His historical and archival stuff now resides at my home. This includes old attendance records, Blenders (the former newsletter), Board meeting notes, chapter show programs and scripts, Harmonizers, chapter show and contest audio and video tapes, Society stuff, and lots of music in the form of Society printed sheet and music books, hand written arrangements, and other non-BHS quartet music. We actually have few members who have the musical ability to do the job of section leader and the ones we do have are not able to do all that is needed. An administrative section leader would work with the musical section leader to help him do a better job. If you look at the list of things a section leader should do and leave off the musical part, what is left is what the administrative section leader could do.

As things stand now, Paul is carrying too much of the load. This didn't come from him, it is my observation. He may even enjoy carrying this much of the load but it is not efficient and is hurting the chorus. I say this because the comments and complaints I hear from members are about things that would not exist if our sections were better managed.

The adm. SL could be a liaison to the membership VP by being an advocate and spokesman for their sections and the person who would inform and implement actions in their sections that the director and/or board believe is needed. In addition to this, an adm. SL could play a key role in implementing the ideas we brought back from the Ashville meeting and even participate in deciding how these ideas will be implemented.

When I asked for volunteers to function as adm. SL I got little response. This may be because I didn't promote it enough or explain what it would entail. The key thing about this is – it gives more members a chance to have a big impact on the direction, emphasis and quality of singing our chorus does. Yes, there will be responsibility, but it can also be very rewarding. These people could be the difference in whether our hobby survives to the next generation.

At our regular meeting on Aug. 20 we will have section meetings to elect people to this office. It is my hope that all who would be willing to do this job would make it known to their sections at this meeting. The person elected should want to do the job, not just get drafted. If a large number of members want the chorus to improve, a lot of members will want to do this job.

Director - Paul Blazek

Song Learning Method, (Easy, Accurate and Fast!)

Balance the left and right channels of your stereo so your voice part on the learning recording is loud enough to be easily heard above the other 3 parts, or use the part-predominant track if you don't have a balance control.

- 1. Listening Step While following your voice part notes on the sheet music (if you do not read music, follow the notes visually by position), listen to your part without singing 2 to 4 times through depending on difficulty. Listen extra times to places that seem tough or that do not seem to match what you see on the sheet music. (The recording and sheet music are pre-checked and should match if you do find an error, please notify the music committee.)
- 2. Doo-doo-doo Step Sing "doo-doo-doo" on your part 2 to 4 times through. Learn to match the pitches and rhythms of the learning recording. Set the recording louder than your "doo-ing" and let it lead your learning. Again, "doo" extra times on the tough places. If there's a place too tough to get from the recording, see your section leader do not "shrug-off" and rehearse mistakes.
- 3. Muscle Memory Step Stand and silently mime the song 2 to 4 times through with the recording. Breathe and support as if actually singing. Form vowels and consonants with lips and tongue as if you were singing a perfect rendition. Silently create the physical throat and larynx formations for accurate pitches and freely produced tone as if singing a perfect unison duet with the recorded voice.
- 4. Full Singing Step Put it all together and fully sing with the recording. Let the recording continue to lead your learning on the first run-through or two. Then, on successive reps, gradually shift the channel balance on the stereo until you are tuning your voice to the other three parts quartet-style. You can also sing with the full mix or 3-part track.

Please remember to practice Riser Etiquette at all our rehearsals. That is good practice for when we are actually performing.

- 1. NEVER applaud a quartet after performing before an audience (this does NOT include Four-On-The-Floor during rehearsal).
- 2. Do not talk to each other, whisper, or make other comments during a performance. If we practice this during rehearsals we can get a lot more work done. Making remarks that YOU think is funny does not lend itself to a particularly good rehearsal time.
- 3. Stand straight and tall with a good singing posture...one foot slightly ahead of the other about six inches apart, hands at your side unless you are doing a rehearsed gesture (this is at Paul's direction).
- 4. Keep your face animated, smile, make your eyes dance.
- 5. Did I mention SMILE? If not...SMILE.

On our Valentine's Day quartets. If you wish to be involved but not necessarily sing, a good Valentine's Day quartet is composed of FIVE people. We desperately need drivers for each of the quartets. Each quartet needs a driver with a car that will comfortably carry that many people. You will be paid mileage at the going rate (I think that is now 48 cents a mile, might be slightly less). Sometimes a gig is in an area where parking may be a problem. The driver drops off the quartet and is able to circle the block while they are performing. That usually takes no more than five to ten minutes. If you would like to be a driver please contact Strick and let him know. His email address is strick@vol.com and he would love to hear from you.

East Ridge - OK, but not in residential areas and must not be a traffic hazard

Ft. Oglethorpe - No signs on city right of way.

Lookout Mtn, GA - No, not even on private property

Lookout Mtn, TN - No, not even on private property

Red Bank - OK, but must not a traffic hazard

Rossville - OK, but must not a traffic hazard

Signal Mtn - Not on city right of way. If on private property the must be on the other side of power line which marks the right of way

Walden - Not on city right of way, but we are approved for one sign at top of W road for seven days.

Hamilton County - OK on Country Roads as long as they are not a traffic hazard

Interstates and State Highways - Officially not allowed on state property. Many people put signs up for a short time (like for a Kmart sale on Hwy 58) and if the maintenance people see them, they may be removed. For a short promotion like ours, we may be ok. Interstate off ramps are state property. Since they connect to city property, it is not clear how they would be treated by cities that do not allow signs (if the city complained, the state would most likely would remove them.)

If you have already used an old form, that's ok, I'll take it. If someone has a request for something other than a standard delivery, please contact me for pricing. (423)762-8936 As usual, try to get as big a time window as possible, for delivery. DO NOT agree to a specific time for delivery unless, the person ordering is agreeable to pay more money. As i said check, check with me first. I may be asking some individuals for help with taking phone orders and getting product ready. Help if you can!

It would take a lot of courage for some of us to volunteer for this but once we did it we would probably be glad we did. Newer members would possibly feel less threatened if they see our best singers subject themselves to this kind of assessment and show that we all have room for improvement.

Even the best quartets get individual coaching on a regular basis. Why not take a chance and see if we can improve ourselves and the chorus through assessments rather than view it as a pass to compete in contest.



Key Concepts in Choral Singing: As we all know, our chorus can also be called an ensemble. Singing in an ensemble is all about doing a few basics not only correctly but CONSISTENTLY. A high degree of consistency equals a higher score at contest, a better sound at sing outs and, more importantly, a more satisfying experience for all of us both individually and as a chorus. For the next several weeks I will be passing on some tips I have found on how each of us can contribute to improving our ensemble sound. I got this information from some highly respected Barbershop sources but there is nothing here that Paul has not already tried to teach us. Tip #1:

BLEND:

- Make a sound that blends in with the guys around you.
- Add to the sound around you.
- Don't sing PAST the sound around you.
- ALWAYS sing in tune; tune to the high side of where you need to be.

Wasn't joke night fun! Or at least interesting. I don't think I'd ever heard so many long, draw up stories in my life. If we wish to share future jokes with the chapter, we should remember that brevity is a blessing. But I do appreciate everyone's participation.

Several people have reported that sectional rehearsals are going well, and it has sped up the learning process for How's Every Little Thing in Dixie. We've only got four more Mondays before we have to perform the song on stage in Winston Salem. So listen to your learning CDs, get out the music, and review your notes, and learn the words. We still have to add the choreography and special effects.

I also think sectionals are helping each of us to learn that it is not necessary to over sing in order to be heard. By working back stage at Dixie contests and International, I have observed that the choruses that score higher sing softer. Each man

attempts to focus his sound directly on to the director, and by not getting overly excited, increase the probability that they will sing the notes and words correctly and with good sound. Sometimes all of us over sing and make our sound "splat" for all to hear, and it is not really that pretty. When Paul calls for us to sing with a nine or a ten, that does not mean to sing as loud as you possibly can, but to sing with good quality with increased volume. But singing softer means any mistakes individual members make in entrances, cut offs, or notes, will stand off even more. So please get off the paper as soon as possible with How's Every Thing in Dixie and lets have a good score in Winston Salem.

The spring show patriotic theme will give us an oppertunity to get people to come who might not otherwise. Be thinking of people who might attend if we pitch the patrotic angle.

Here are some ideas: Former and current members of the military (encourage to wear uniform). Police and fire departments. If some of these come as a group we could recognize them during the show. Politicians, fellow church members, and people who you know to be patriotic. You can probably think of others. If groups such as this want to buy blocks of tickets we could probably give some discount. Maybe even seat them together. Keep the wheels rolling and the music humming as we prepare for the spring show.

Music & Performance VP -Art Southerlin

Key Concepts in Choral Singing: We are continuing our 5-part series with some tips on PRODUCTION. We need to employ these techniques correctly AND consistently. Remember that a high degree of consistency equals a higher score at contest, a better sound at sing outs and a more satisfying experience for all of us. Here is **Tip# 3**:

PRODUCTION:

- Every sound should be TALL and FORWARD (Sound familiar?). ALWAYS do both of these. Other ways to express this: 1) every sound has width and brilliance; 2) every sound has depth and ping.
- If a sound is "too dark", it's because it doesn't have enough ping, brilliance, forward feel.
- If a sound is "too bright", it's because it doesn't have enough height, chest tone, tallness, warmth.
- NEVER take away resonance, always add. (Where have I heard that before?)
- The smoothness, fullness and drive in the sound happens from the back of your mouth all the way down to your toes
- The diction and clarity in the sound happens from your tongue and lips diction DOESN'T happen anywhere behind this. SO...keep your jaw dropped ALWAYS; make the diction happen with your tongue and by keeping the sounds on your lips.

Key Concepts in Choral Singing: Tip number 4 in our 5-part series is concerned with vowels. Paul stresses these vowel sounds at nearly every rehearsal. If you don't have a copy of the vowel chart then let me know. I will make copies for you. As I have stated in each of these articles, we need to employ these techniques correctly AND consistently. That high degree of consistency yields a higher score at contest, a better sound at sing outs and a more satisfying experience for all of us. Please read Tip# 4:

VOWELS:

- There are 12 and ONLY 12 vowel sounds.
- They all involve a vertical mouth shape, trumpeted lips.
- Most involve tucking the sides of your mouth in.
- DON'T let any sound get spread horizontally.
- Breathe through the vowel you are about to sing.
- The target vowel ALWAYS happens at the note value. Anything before the target vowel happens BEFORE this note, and the stuff after the target happens at the end of the note.

That opinion changed on March 2 however, when we had a break out practice session and found we could sing the song with authority and enthusiasm and consistently hold pitch. With a little more polish we may be able to wow the folks at Winston-Salem.

Like sing-outs? Of course we do. How about with 100+ singers? It could happen. Chad Guyton is talking to Clay Hines about combining the AVP, Stone Mtn., Cleveland and Chattanooga chapters to sing the national anthem for an Atlanta Braves baseball game. Stay tuned for developments.

Music & Performance VP -Art Southerlin

Key Concepts in Choral Singing: This last tip in our 5-part series is concerned with the concept of Musicality. The other concepts we've reviewed are about the basics. Musicality is about style and feeling. It is the "icing on the cake." Like the difference between a framing carpenter and a finish carpenter, Musicality reveals the "art" in our performance. In striving to be musical artists, we need to employ these and all of the other techniques we've learned about correctly AND consistently. By employing these concepts with a high degree of consistency, we should earn a higher score at contest and achieve a better and more satisfying sound at sing outs and rehearsals. Once again, there's nothing here that Paul has not stressed over and over at rehearsals. Tip# 5:

MUSICALITY:

- Make this happen on your own.
- Everything should have artistry to it.
- Every line and held note has direction.
- Important words should sound important; unimportant words (usually "the", "of", "an") should be de-stressed.
- Lines that flow should flow and not have sounds that jump out. Everything should flow "in-line" as opposed to side-to-side.

We will work on the contest set with a Singing judge to coach us.

Program VP -Bill Slack

Thank you, thank you, thank you to the young ladies who prepared the birthday cake and brought the ice cream and cokes for the March 9th meeting (see the photograph by Sherry Fowler below). And we should be very proud of three of our regular members who all attained the age of 80 this month. God willing, we will all reach that exalted age at some point.

Next week the entire rehearsal will be devoted to contest preparations. There will be no quarteting (except see my last paragraph) and few, if any, announcements. After the contest, we begin the big push for preparations for our May show. The show will need quartet participation, and our registered quartets can't and shouldn't do every song, as it becomes boring to the audience to see and hear the same guys. So be talking with other members and let's put together several show quartets.

The quartet contest set for June 15th is approaching. Each quartet member who participates will receive a memento, and the winning quartet members will each receive prizes from Harmony Marketplace. These prizes for quarteting have been funded by our registered quartets to show their appreciation for the society and the support of chapter membership.

The results of the survey which were completed among the rehearsal attendees in January were as follows: Approximately 75% of the members felt that we needed more sectional rehearsals. 25% thought we needed no sectionals or did not answer that question. Over 50% of the members who responded stated that they would come early to practice in a sectional; come early to practice choreography; come early for a voice lesson; or come early to learn pole cat numbers. Almost unanimously the responders felt that the chapter had improved over the last twelve months. Other

comments on the survey, in no particular order, were that we need more quarteting; less warmup time; and more exposure and sing outs.

A college quartet from Clevland will be at our meeting on Monday to do a 2 song set they will be perfoming at Winston/Salem. They need alot of applause, so go crazy over them as they haven't ever done this before. They think we're old and good and want our input.

The district newsletter is apparently still in the development stage. The district is sending out e-mails they are calling the Dixie District Newsletter but when you open it you find that it is the Central States Newsletter. When I questioned our district about this I was told they are doing this because Dixie does not yet have a newsletter. I hope they get their act together soon.

Music & Performance VP -Art Southerlin

Our score at contest was not where we wanted it to be. We were shooting for a 65 but came in at just over 60. The judges noted that we need to work on breath support, singing in-tune, singing as a unit (singing within the sound) and presentation (mainly facial). There were other comments but these were the main ones – and we're familiar with all of them because we talk about them all of the time. Review the 5 tips we published in this newsletter over the last couple of months. It was all covered there. That's the bad news. The good news is that it is ALL FIXABLE. We just need to get serious as a chorus and WORK ON IT!

Barbershop is "precision singing", and it's "neckid" singing too! There's no musical accompaniment to cover up our mistakes and we aren't a large enough group for our individual mistakes to get lost in the "Big Sound." Therefore we've got to become <u>precision singers</u>. The only way to do that is for each of us to get serious about our contribution to the sound <u>and to each other</u>. We OWE IT to each other to come to rehearsal each week PREPARED! What does prepared mean? It means that we have devoted an appropriate amount of time outside of our weekly meetings to practice our music, to practice breathing and breath-support, to practice our vowel sounds, to practice our "facial gestures" in the mirror at home and on and on..... You know better than I do what is required. Most everyone in the chorus has been at this far longer than I have and, yes, I am as guilty as anyone!

Are we doing this just to get a better score and make Paul look good? The answer is a resounding NO!! We are doing this so that we can give our audiences (our families and friends!!) the absolute best performances that we are capable of delivering! We owe that to them and to each other! We should be doing our best because it FEELS GOOD to sing well and it FEELS GOOD to be proud of the way we sing as a chorus – and right now we do not sing as well as we are capable of singing. This is a FUN hobby and we are a FUN group of guys! We had a great spark of enthusiasm going into contest! Let's not let this get us down! Let's rededicate ourselves to each other and to our hobby and reap the benefits of the hard work ahead!

The only top ten quartets at Winston Salem not from these chapters were from Memphis. Thus, there is a strong correlation between good quarteting and good choruses.

Music & Performance VP -Art Southerlin

Scoring Categories – Quite a few chorus members (including yours truly) seem to be confused about how we are judged at contest. I'm going to attempt to explain in the next few issues of our newsletter (including this one) how the 3 scoring categories work. I took this information straight out of the BHS Contest Rules & Regulations. You can find that publication for free on the BHS website. Here goes #1 - MUSIC:

Each scoring judge awards a score from 1 to 100 for each song. All contestants will be judged in the three scoring categories of **Music**, Presentation and Singing.

I. The Music judge evaluates the song and the arrangement, as performed. A) He adjudicates the musical elements in the performance: melody, harmony, range and tessitura (the part of the register in which most of the tones of a melody or voice part lie), tempo and rhythm and meter, construction and form, and embellishments. B) He judges how well the musical elements of the performance establish a theme and the degree to which the performance demonstrates an artistic sensitivity to that theme. C) He adjudicates the degree to which the musical elements of the song and arrangement display the hallmarks of the barbershop style.

In other words the Music judge evaluates how pleasing and entertaining the music and arrangement were as the contestant performed it – NOT as it was written. He judges the PERFORMANCE.

Member Involvement VP -Wally Edmondson

I will hand out Salute To America tickets this Monday. Please bring your money and unsold tickets back by May 4. That's only three weeks to sell tickets so there is no time to waste. If you can't sell someone a ticket to the show, mention that we will be singing at the Lookouts game on June 2.

Scoring Categories – In the last issue of the newsletter we discussed how the Music category is judged. This time we're tackling Presentation. This is where we find out that Barbershop is not just singing – it's ENTERTAINMENT – and at contest we are scored on how well we entertained – not just on how well we sang the words and notes. Let's hear it for #2 – **Presentation!**

Each scoring judge awards a score from 1 to 100 for each song. All contestants will be judged in the three scoring categories of Music, **Presentation** and Singing.

II. The Presentation judge evaluates how effectively a performer brings the song to life; that is, the believability of the theme in its musical and visual setting. He responds to both the vocal and visual aspects of the presentation, but he principally evaluates the interaction of those aspects as they work together to create the image of the song. He adjudicates the quality and appropriateness of the overall effect. The Presentation judge evaluates everything about the performance that contributes to emotional impact upon the audience.

This sounds like a job for that "Sensitive Man" we keep hearing about from the women in our lives. Wow! We can't get away with just words and notes! Now we have to get in touch with our feelings and paint a picture for our audience that shows those feelings in a genuine and believable fashion! Are you the stoic, "Marlboro Man" or the Indian Chief with the tear in his eye? (Remember that one?) Hey, didn't somebody call this an "art form" last Monday night??

Please make every effort to attend all remaining rehearsals before the show - we've made a lot of progress, and I'm really impressed with how we seem to remain on pitch all evening, but we still have a way to go before we're ready for the show, not to mention the other performances we have coming up. Thanks for your commitment to the Chorus!

Member Involvement VP –Wally Edmondson

We only have two weeks left to sell tickets. Most of you have picked up five or ten tickets and I appreciate it. It's far easier to sell tickets if you have them with you at all times. - 1. Registered quartets are not eligible to compete or prizes.
- 2. Non-Members (ringers) may participate in a quartet.
- 3. There will be three judges who will not be barbershoppers, and their criteria for evaluating quartets in unknown.
- 4. Judges may be and may even expect to be bribed, flattered or lied to.
- 5. Members of registered quartets can participate, but with no more than one other member of a registered quartet. That is, a quartet can have two members of registered quartets but two non-members.
- 6. Each quartet will be expected to do at least one song.
- 7. These rules may be added to, amended, or even changed at the program vice presidents sole discretion.

This is a purely fun night. The registered quartets are expected to attend and to entertain between contestants. All members should plan to attend, listen, watch, and participate. Every contestant will be recognized, and each participant in a quartet which wins will receive a very nice "prize". Since all of us know our contest songs, our show songs, and even

pole cats, we all can participate. So when we are sitting around at break, or waiting for the show to begin, or between rehearsals, talk amongst yourself and lets have as many participating quartets as we can.

1. Quartet participants may hold and use sheet music during their performance.

2. Members of registered quartets will not be qualified for singing with more than two other registered quartet members if they are singing a part other than their normal part. For example, if Fred sings bass instead of tenor, or Strick sings lead instead of bass, they will not be counted as members of registered quartets for the purpose of that participation.

We have already had one quartet entered, and thus they are in the lead.





There will NOT be a MLT meeting this Monday. There will be a joint MLT/Board meeting on the 13th.

RISER READY": On January 29, 2007, the members of our chapter voted almost unanimously (one abstention if I'm not mistaken) in favor of amending the chapter's Code of Regulations to require all chapter members who participate in our public and/or competitive performances to meet certain standards. One of those standards requires all performers to have the "ability to sing the words and music with 95% accuracy as determined by the Chorus Director or his agent." To my knowledge no program was implemented at that time to ensure that this standard is met. That's where "Riser Ready" comes into play.

Under the Riser Ready program each member of the chapter who wishes to sing as part of the Choo-Choo Chorus at any public and/or private performances must demonstrate his ability to sing the words and notes to our repertoire songs with 95% accuracy as called for in our Code of Regulations. The Section Leaders will act as the agents of the Chorus Director and will be working with each member of their respective sections to help EVERYONE meet the standard. The cutoff date for qualifying on the whole repertoire has not been determined as yet, nor has the list of songs in our repertoire been chosen (other than the two songs for contest). I expect that it will take quite some time (probably into springtime) to get everyone fully qualified. The purpose of this program is to improve EVERY member's capability and to work with EVERY member until they are able to meet this performance standard. In the meantime EVERYONE is eligible to sing at ALL of our performances until a cutoff time is chosen. After the cutoff we will continue to work with anyone who is struggling but only "Riser Ready" singers will be allowed to sing at our performances.

The goal for qualification for the two (2) Fall Contest songs is a different story. We will begin assessing members who want to sing at contest on Monday, August 3. We hope to get everyone qualified by August 31 in order to give us 3 to 4 weeks of serious rehearsal time before the convention.

This is intended to be a FLEXIBLE program. It will change as the needs of the chapter/chorus change. We are moving into uncharted waters with this and we ask that you be patient with us as we will make some mistakes along the way. Rest assured, though, that we want ALL of our members to complete the journey TOGETHER!

Please feel free to ask me any questions or express any concerns that you might have. I understand that this is a major change for our chapter and that it will cause some of our members to feel uneasy. Don't fret about it – let's talk about it!

Coaching Notes - Steve Wixson

Summary of Ev's coaching (as best as I can read my notes with help from Lebron.) He is a Presentation judge.

Tuning. He stopped us in the middle of the first phrase. The contrast between tuning and our first sound was too great. He had us tune using 'ng' instead of 'oo.'

Choppiness. He stopped us after our first phrase. He had one member say "there's no place on earth." He had two others say it one at a time, and each of them sounded natural by themselves. He then had all three say it together and it became choppy. He worked with the three until they could say it naturally together. Then did the same with the whole chorus. We then worked on singing it that way until it gelled. He told us we should not hold the word "There's" but sing the whole phrase as one word with several syllables with the accent on "no." Several members said "wow" when we heard what we could do.

Timing/singing on the beat. Ev noted that we are late on lots of beats and most entrances. He led an exercise where we put our arms on the shoulders of the guys next to us as in Lulu and beat time with our fingers. What was happening could be felt. That exercise really helped.

Vowel production. He had lots to say, but I don't know how to put it in words except to say we need to work harder.

Breathing. We are lazy breathers. Our singing quality disintegrates at the end of phrases. We need to breathe much faster. We needed to push the end of each phrase!

Living our lyrics and the importance of Body Language. He gave an example of how we naturally tell children the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. He/we put our whole body into it. He noted how we all have a range of emotions that we've experienced in our lifetime and we need to use them as we sing each song. Singing comes from the heart. The body language must preced the words, as when we smile and put out our hand before greeting someone.

He worked on many little things. Like emphasizing words like 'my birthday' to make it more personal and believable. The word "How" is one of the words that needs to be treated this way. The Bass section needs to sound more natural and forward, not swallowing the sound and the tenors needed to make a taller sound when they stand out near the end of HELTiD.

He noted that we need to sing the first line so it sounds like magic. That first impression on the judges is muey importante.

Confidence. Sing with it. Don't fidget or act nervous. This is not the first time you've sung, and you know how it feels to perform. Our first tuning on the evening was not confident. You can do that well. So stand tall and sing out.

Poor attendance at our most recent Saturday sing outs have our Business Manager questioning if he should accept similar booking opportunities. None of us can make all the sing outs, but if we like these activities, and I think we do, we need to find some way to know ahead of time who will be there. One way might be to change the way we start the decision making. Instead of asking for a show of hands we could actually take down the names of those who would commit to being there. The only problem with this is that we sometimes have personal emergencies come up that make it impossible to keep our commitment. How often this happens I don't know. When it comes right down to it we must accept that it takes little to make some of our members miss a sing out and there is nothing we can do to change that. If we put too much pressure on these people they will drop out of the chorus completely.

If we could know, say, 24 hours ahead of time who would be at a gig it would help. Earlier notice would be better. With enough advance notice that few would show up we might could reschedule, or in extreme situations we could call on a registered quartet to sub for the chorus.

I think it would be wonderful if the section administrators always knew who in their section was going to be there so he could make the director aware of a potential problem. These administrators however, need the help and cooperation of everyone in his section to do this. It would be asking too much of the administrators to call everyone in his section. When would he call? Two weeks before the gig? One week? Two days? One day? Every day? What about those he could not reach? The membership would soon get tired of getting all those calls anyway.

The thing that would help is for all of us to understand that each of us is being counted on and we should call our section administrator as soon as we find out that we can't make a gig. Those who have the attitude, "I will go if I feel like it, but I won't let anybody know if I am not going and it won't matter if I am not there", are letting the rest of the group down, letting down the people who booked us, and harming the preservation of barbershop music and the opportunity for barbershop groups now and in the future to perform.

Let me urge you to take responsibility for your actions and let your administrator know when you are not able to make a performance. It is not that hard to do to make a phone call or send an e-mail.

Vocal Education Series

Part 4 -- Vocal Technic: Fine Tuning

By René Torres

In this article we look at some mental and physical processes that affect a singer's ability to maintain pitch and produce sounds of good tonal quality. It takes discipline and control of mind and body to become a "smart" singer.

Mind's eye notes.

There are three ways of "seeing" any note. First, you must physically see the note, as on the sheet of music. Then, you must "see" it in your mind's eye. In other words, you must visualize the note (hear it) in your mind before you even think of opening your mouth to sing it. Singing it is actually the third step of the process. Only when what you see, what your mind interprets, and what you sing are the same will you get truly correct music. Don't make the mistake of singing a note as you see it on paper. This skips the most important step: developing a "mind's eye" view of the music. Without that the interpretation, style, and placing of the music in its proper context are not possible. The mechanical reflex from eye to throat is merely the interpretation of a sound, not making music.

Answer: The altitude above you and the runway behind you.

The question is: "As a pilot, what are the two things you can never use?" As a singer, however, the answer to this question is "the breath you never take." Don't make the mistake of taking a smaller breath on a short phrase because you don't think you need it. Breathing a full tank of air every time should be a natural and subconscious objective of every singer.

The main reason most singers flat a note--and usually at the end of a phrase--is directly attributable to the amount of usable air left in the lungs. Therefore, the more air you have left, the easier it is to hold the pitch or sing a decrease in volume. You will be a more confident singer when you control your breathing. The confidence will show in your facial expression and you will increase your ability to "sell" the song.

Straight notes climb stairs.

Any time you are singing a sustained note, you must make a conscious effort to imagine that it is straight up a flight of stairs, not a level playing field. As you use up air, the muscles have less resistance to push against, and the normal tendency is to relax the pressure. The result is a gradual drop in pitch. If you visualize yourself climbing stairs, it will be easier to maintain the pitch.

It is much harder to sing softly than loudly.

You may have found this out early on. The wrong way to sing softly is to relax the muscles. Sure, it will sound softer, but you will have lost the control of the voice that you had when you were singing louder. The note will sound listless and without color. Perform the following test to see why it is harder to sing softly than loudly. Sing one note loudly, then gradually decrease the volume until you can barely hear it, and then increase the volume again to its louder level. Repeat this on one breath. You will see that it is very difficult to do. In fact, it is probably one of the hardest things to master. Until you get it right, you will experience breaks in the sound, inconsistent pitch, wobbles, and even muscle spasms. All this is to show that, if you maintain constant tension on the air-supplying muscles (near the throat), it is easier to change volume without breaks or wobbles.

Rainbows and strings of pearls.

Singing masters in the era of *bel canto* used to have very descriptive terms for their craft. Two of the expressions used to describe a phrase of music seem appropriate. They would describe a musical phrase as a rainbow, where the notes were formed one after the other, in all their glory, color and splendor. Others described the musical phrase as a string of pearls coming out of the singer's mouth—separate, yet joined in making a beautiful object. The metaphors are not wasted if you consider that a musical phrase should be an integrated whole. Think of rainbows and pearls next time you find yourself singing choppy phrases.

Unkink your pipes.

Next time you stand on the risers, look at the posture of some of the men around you. It's a miracle they don't finish the evening feeling more tired than when they started. It's not because they have been on their feet for several hours but, rather, they have wasted the opportunity for invigorating exercise during rehearsal. And, what's more, the music suffers. Why? Because poor posture has inhibited efficient breathing while singing in a standing position. Those pearls mentioned earlier are going to have to a very tough time coming out of a pipe that has twists, turns, slumps, and bumps in it. So stand up straight! Make sure your airflow passages are open, relaxed, uninterrupted, and free. When you sing beautiful music, take a full breath every time and stand properly, you can actually feel a mental and physical "high" come over you, much like what a jogger feels during and after a good workout. If you finish a song more tired than when you started, you are doing something wrong.

Vowels versus consonants.

In singing, vowels carry the notes, but the consonants give it meaning. Following the string-of-pearls analogy, consider the pearls to be the vowels and the string to be the consonants. You can't have one without the other, and everything works together. Vowels should be open and expressive with the consonant transitions placed in such a way as to connect the vowel sounds in whatever way the song is to be interpreted. Of course, interpretation depends on both music and lyrics, especially lyrics. We will explore words and their meaning in Part 5.

The purpose of the sectional is not only to learn your words and notes, but by rehearsing them together, as a section, to achieve a "unit sound" so that all members of the section will be singing each note, each word, and each part of the song with the same vowel sound, dynamics and interpretation. This is only achieved by knowing your words and notes, and then going forward to learn how the section will be performing that particular song.

Remember, that assessments for each competition song are ongoing. Either your section leader or Paul can complete your assessment on each song. If you have not been evaluated and passed on both competition songs, then you will not be competing in October. Likewise, if you have not been assessed on the chorus repertoire songs, then you will be asked to step off the risers for any sing out. These are the steps necessary to have the chorus get "riser ready".



I think the leadership is ready and willing to do this but membership should understand there will be a price to pay, it won't come easy, and the leadership will need the support and cooperation of the members or we will succeed only in creating discontent. This would be a good time for each of us to do some soul searching and ask ourselves - are we willing to pay the price to reach another level? When you have your answer, talk to one of the officers about it. If it turns out that we have enough members willing to commit to this idea, we will chart a new course for the chorus. If the membership is not willing to make a commitment there will be no point in starting along this path. It is in your hands. What will our future be?

I'm also pleased with what I perceived as a consensus among all of us to commit to an effort to produce DRAMATIC improvement for the Fall Contest. Did I hear a 65??

That kind of improvement will take quite a commitment from each of us personally (including me!).

- 1. Your/my commitment to learn the words and notes outside of rehearsals. (Paul's job is to guide the chorus in POLISHING the performance NOT to teach us the songs).
 - 2. Your/my commitment to spend time each week (at home) trying to improve your/my own vocal technique.
 - 3. Your/my commitment to practice Stage Presence (Face and Choreography) outside of rehearsals.
- 4. Your/my commitment to learn to become an actor/entertainer who can express emotion and connect with the audience using song, facial expression and body movement.
- 5. Your/my commitment to overcome your/my fear of personal failure (Stage Fright). The judges said that we seemed timid, afraid to "turn it loose!"

I've attached a link (click here) of FAQ's from the Masters of Harmony website (why not steal from the best??) Take some time and read through these. They generally set the tone for what I think each of us committed to last Monday evening. If we're really serious (really committed on a personal basis) we can accomplish that dramatic improvement - but it takes a surprising amount of personal time and effort (and that's difficult to sustain). Oh yeah, don't forget that that we want ALL of our chorus members to take part in that Fall Contest performance and ALL of us to celebrate TOGETHER when we accomplish our goal. Did I hear a 65??

Guys, I was very impressed by the discussion last Monday night. It looks like we have a majority of you who want to score 65 or better this fall so I'll be stepping up our level of activities to meet that goal. I was particularly heartened by question from those who didn't go to Greenville and yet still want to improve. 



- 4) Put the music down, listen to the track and sing along from memory. Do this 3 times.

Chapter Historian -Fred Jesse

The recent May/June Harmonizer notes briefly that Dr. Jim Henry's doctoral thesis was on the roots of barbershop music, and traced it to African-American origins. For those who keep these old Harmonizers, he wrote an article in the July/August 2001 Harmonizer about it. A very interesting article noting the earliest known reference to barbershop music is associated with black quartets. The sheet music pictured in the 2001 article, "Play That Barber Shop Chord", was printed in 1910. If you wish to see the entire sheet music with words, some might find offensive, go to "levysheetmusic" and type in the title. Also interesting is that the barbershop chord we sing is not really evident in the piano accompaniment to the vocal in that song. I wonder if a barbershop arrangement has ever been made of that song. It is certainly part of barbershop history.
