The Provident Chorus was an active part of the Provident environment during the 1950's and 60's, but was disbanded in the early 1970's. Due to employee request, the Chorus was reorganized in 1990 with Paul Stone as its director. Paul's father, Lamar Stone, was an assistant director of and soloist in the chorus during the 50's and 60's. The original chorus appeared on television at both Easter and Christmas most years and was well known throughout the Chattanooga area. The new chorus has appeared on stage at Riverbend for the last two years and was a part of the Christmas on the River celebration last year. They have also performed at many Provident functions for both employees and retirees.

A Barbershop chair makes an excellent place to nap or sing. Besides an antique one is worth a bundle!

5th Day.....5 Baritones

6th Day.....6 Bases Booming

Bases are the original boom boxes!

7th Day.....7 Tenors Screaming
