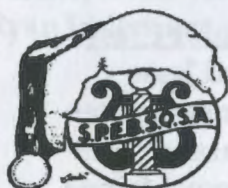

Silent Night

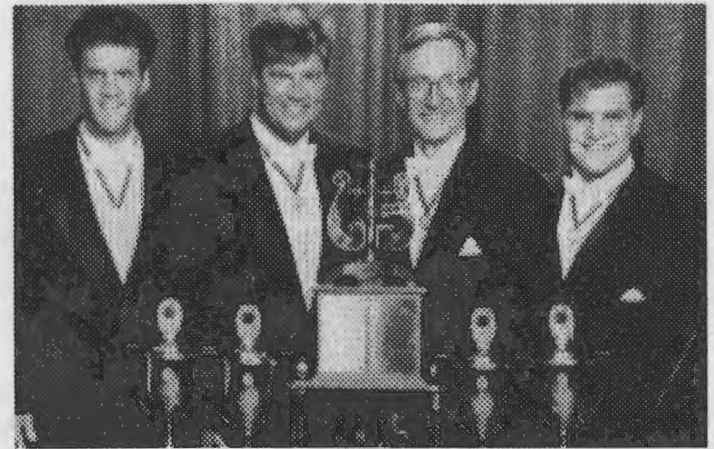
Silent night, Holy night! All is calm,

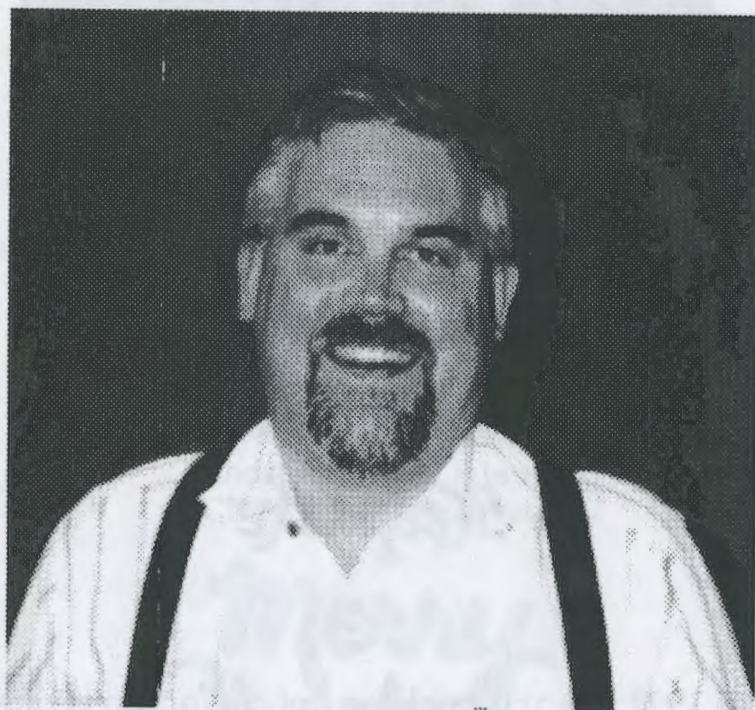

Once upon a time, four young men aspired to sing in a quartet known for its musical excellence—a means for touching the hearts of every audience they sang for, and a way to make their musical dreams a reality. These dreams were fulfilled as they joined hands in New Orleans, singing "Keep the Whole World Singing," after a rousing ovation declared Keepsake the 1992 international quartet champion.
