A gifted musician, Paul has been the director of the Chattanooga Choo Choo Barbershop Chorus for the last decade. Although a natural bass, he can sing all four parts. The chorus, under Paul's direction, has continued to improve its standing in the Dixie District of the Barbershop Singing Society. Paul's quartet, Stage II, has won the Volunteer Division quartet contest. Paul and his wife, Lindy, a teacher of children with special needs, have been devoted to the Special Olympics. For many years the chorus has been privileged to sing the National Anthem to start the games.

#### Class of '94

Class of '94 is a young, exciting quartet that sings in the barbershop style. They got together in the Fall of 1993 and since then they have entertained and thrilled audiences all over the Atlanta area and beyond. The four members of the group are: Eric King, tenor; Dylan Oxford, lead; Ryan Fuller, baritone; and Cliff White, bass. Eric and Cliff sang together in high school, while Ryan and Dylan were in a quartet together at Georgia Tech.

Class of '94 originally got together to compete in the International Collegiate Quartet Contest. After much thought, they instead entered into the regular quartet contest and placed a respectable third in the southeast. This placement earned them a spot on the international stage in Pittsburgh during the 1994 International Barbershop contest.

The quartet has sung on barbershop and other shows as far away as Cincinnati, Ohio. They recently recorded their first album, Now That's Class, which contains old standards as well as original, "younger", selections.

All four members of the quartet are actively involved in the leadership of the Stone Mountain Barbershop Chorus. The chorus and quartet are part of larger group known as SPEBSQSA (The Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barbershop Quartet Singing in America). This is the largest all-male singing organization in the world.

Class of '94 hope they show everyone that barbershop music is as enjoyable to the listener as it is to the singer.

#### Just What Is Barbershop Music?

On Saturday night, April 11, 1938, twenty-five men gathered at a hotel in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the invitation of two of them to sing in barbershop quartets. As more and more singers appeared in the next few months, Owen C. Cash and Rupert T. Hall founded the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America, Inc., abbreviated as SPEBSQSA, a playful poke at the government agencies whose initials and regulations still plague us.

The style of "barbershop", now written as one word, began around 1900. It is not really four-part harmony but, rather, three parts harmonizing to a known melody, unaccompanied by instruments. The lead sings the melody and is joined by the bass, the lowest part, and the tenor, who sings consistently above the lead. The baritone, ranging above and below the melody, puts in the last note. There is usually one harmonizing chord on each melody note, although sometimes one or more voices add more notes. Often musical rules of time, expression, and word theme are sacrificed to create variety and pleasurable tension in order to delay the reaching of the expected chords.

With headquarters now in Kenosha, the "Society," as Barbershoppers refer to it, has grown into a pastime for almost 35,000 men in the U.S. and Canada, as well as for recently affiliated groups in Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand, Sweden, and other counties. A few hundred choruses and over 2,000 quartets perform regularly in and near their communities and often compete against each other, beginning in small geographic areas, with the high scorers moving up to district levels and the best each July to final contests.
