

At home in Memphis, Split Decision entertains at various civic and social events, and participates in the Memphis Chapter's annual Singing Valentine campaign. They make annual appearances aboard the Mississippi Queen, The American Queen, and the mother of all paddlewheelers, The Delta Queen. They have also competed and performed throughout the society's Dixie District, which covers Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Tennessee, North Carolina, and South Carolina. They were runners-up in 1996 and are the reigning 1997 Dixie District Quartet Champions.

Split Decision sings many original arrangements that vary in style from barbershop standards to jazz, gospel, blues, country, and pop. Although the quartet hails from Memphis, they don't sing ANY Elvis songs.... yet!
