

STEAM ENGINE NO. 349


On stage tonight is a side view of Steam Engine No. 349 which is owned by Chattanooga's Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum. The engine was photographed and then printed on plastic to become part of the fence surrounding the new Erlanger Children's Outpatient Center.

It was given to the Choo Choo Chorus in thanks for our annual Christmas Benefit Shows that have raised over \$50,000 for Erlanger's Boehm Birth Defects Center. And by supporting us tonight at our Annual Show you give us the funding whereby we give the net proceeds from this year's Christmas Show to a local charity.



History of Engine 349

Engine No. 349 was built by Baldwin Locomotive Works in June 1891 for the Savannah & Western Railway, later being sold to the Central of Georgia Railroad in 1894. The 349 is one of the few remaining examples of the most common type of locomotive ever built. The design was so ubiquitous that it earned the name "American" locomotive. It is distinguished by its four small wheels in the front and four large wheels behind, with no wheels in the rear. Thus it is a 4-4-0 type wheel arrangement. Various locomotive manufacturers built the Americantype locomotive from prior to the Civil War until the 1920s. The year of its build - 1891 - is shared with the year that Erlanger's first children hospital was constructed in Chattanooga - making this the perfect engine to loan for display at the new Erlanger Children's Outpatient Center. Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum is honored to have partnered with Erlanger in making this display happen. [Note: the engine was moved to the new Children'sCenter just a few days ago.]

ABOUT THE CHOO CHOO CHORUS

Fifty-six years ago (May 17, 1962), the Chattanooga (Rock City) Chapter became a charter member of what is now the Barbershop Harmony Society.

The Rock City Chorus performed their first show on July 14, 1962 at the new Chattanooga High School auditorium. The Knoxville Smokyland Chorus and Knoxville Sweet Adeline Chorus and the Atlanta Peachtree Chorus along with four quartets, including Dixie District Champions, The Dignitaries, also performed that day.

In 1975 the chorus name was changed to The Mountain City Chorus and in 1982 the name was changed finally to The Choo Choo Chorus. The Chorus has had as many as 62 members in 1963 and as few as 12 members in 1970 and currently has 32 members.

Of ten different musical directors beginning with Dick Clem, our current director, Paul Blazek, has been director for the longest time (30 years). Thirty-two chapter quartets have competed for Dixie District honors over the years and one quartet, the Chattanooga Shoe Shine Boys, won a Dixie District Quartet Championship (1981).

From its inception the chorus has been busy singing in the Chattanooga area. With two contests each year, an annual show, a Christmas show and singing in the community, the men get their barbershop "fix" and provide audiences with lots of entertainment opportunities. With performances ranging from entertaining at a nursing home or retirement center to singing the National Anthem at sporting events, Memorial and Veterans Day ceremonies at the National Cemetery, several Special Olympics events, to performing with the Chattanooga Symphony, the chapter provides ample chances for men to indulge the inner "ham" while making people happy. An added benefit is health improvements as the result of singing - we've had men performing with us into their 90's!

The vision for the future is continued efforts for preservation of barbershop music, entertainment of patrons, help for service projects, and continued friendship with fellow barbershoppers.

Paul Blazek celebrates 31 years as our Director. Paul was born in Chicago, Illinois. He moved to Nashville in 1965 and then to Chattanooga in 1977. He and his wife Lindy have four children, Mary Kathryn, Melissa, Megan, and Matt, and grandchildren Maddie and Caleb. Matt and sonin-law David Grass have sung with the chorus at various times.

Paul joined the Nashville chapter in 1976 and sang in his first barbershop contest at the Cow Palace in San Francisco International that same year. He also competed with Nashville at '77 Philadelphia International and '78 Cincinnati International, and rejoined the Music City Chorus to compete at the International level six times since 2010 and achieve Fifth Place International Bronze Medalist status.

He has been a member of several quartets: Round Mound of Sound (Nashville), Backstage, Stage II, Four Guys, and Honchos (Chattanooga). Paul has attended Harmony College many times, attended the first Director's College in 1990, and many Society-sponsored schools over the years. He was Director of Tullahoma, TN chapter in 1984-85, assistant director of the Chattanooga chapter in 1985-86, and director of the Chattanooga chapter since 1987. He is currently on the Dixie District Board of Directors as Board Member at Large and Chairman of the Budget & Finance Committee. In his spare time, Paul is database administrator for TXI Systems, Inc.

ASSOCIATE CHORUS DIRECTOR - CHUCK WILSON


